Budget Projections

PMA has updated its five year projections for us based upon the up to date list of reductions discussed at the last meeting and sent to you prior to the February 26, 2013 Public Informational Meeting. The projections show the district with just over \$5.47 million in reserves by June 30, 2018. If we are anticipating a \$1 million + deficit for 2019, these reductions should allow the district to not run out of reserves until 2020 or later ASSUMING state and federal aid remain at anticipated (80% GSA) levels. The projections are attached.

Attached also is a summary of the unlevel funding that the Chicago Public Schools receive from the state. I met with Representative Sosnowski on Monday with Mr. Houselog from District 100. He shared his insights into the funding issues as well.
