Data Collection and Common Formative Assessment Analysis

At the early release, we will look at the current data collected through state ISAT scores. During the data analysis, teams will first meet by grade level to assess how their classes fared in 2009. They will also look at how their current group of students scored during last year's testing.

Following a look at the data and breaking down what the strengths and weaknesses are, they will then look at what we can do as a building to increase our students' performances.

- 12:50-1:30—Teachers will look at data from the teams to discuss what patterns they notice and what deficiencies they see.
- 1:40-2:20—Teams will reconvene to discuss what can be done to improve the scores within our building.
- 2:20-2:50—Staff will work on Common Formative Assessments that target areas of concern within their content areas.
