College Plans

Since I have been in North Boone, we have been participating in

the My College Options Survey through IASA. The complete survey results are generally received in the early fall, but the initial returns show the number of our students planning to attend four years of college is rising, up from 96.8% last year to 97.3% this year. Part of this increase may be tied to the OverGrad program that we are involving all of our NBHS students in to help them find college matches and understand the criteria necessary to get into the programs and career fields of their choice. Northern Illinois and Illinois State are the most popular college selections among our current underclassmen. Currently we have 356 students enrolled in OverGrad (we didn't include the Class of 2014), 79% of them have enabled the feature to allow colleges and universities to search their data in order to send them information.
