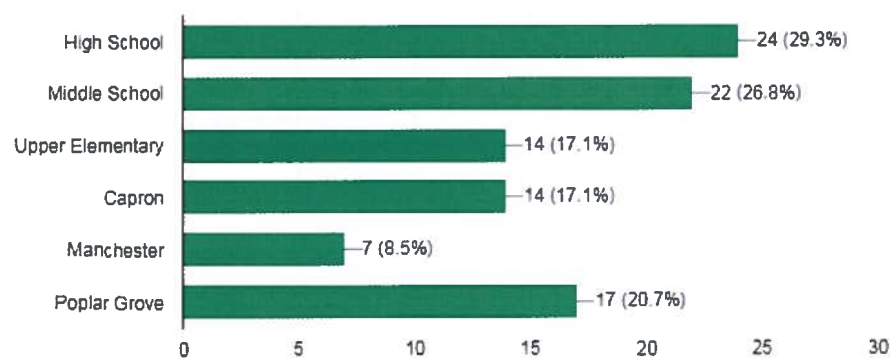

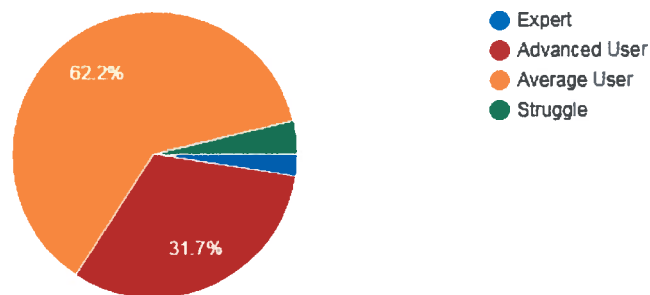
What School, or schools do you teach in?

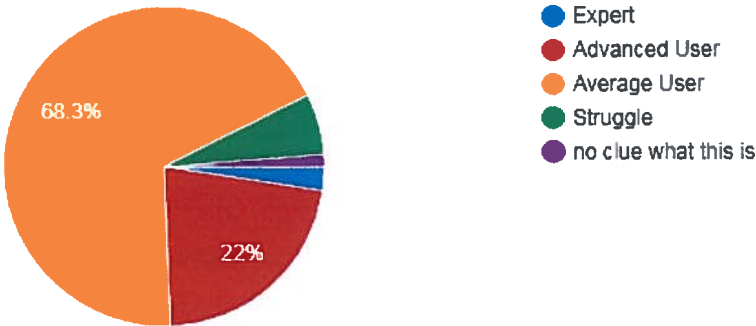
How would you describe your computer skills? (Using the computer in general and computer Hardware such as smart-boards)

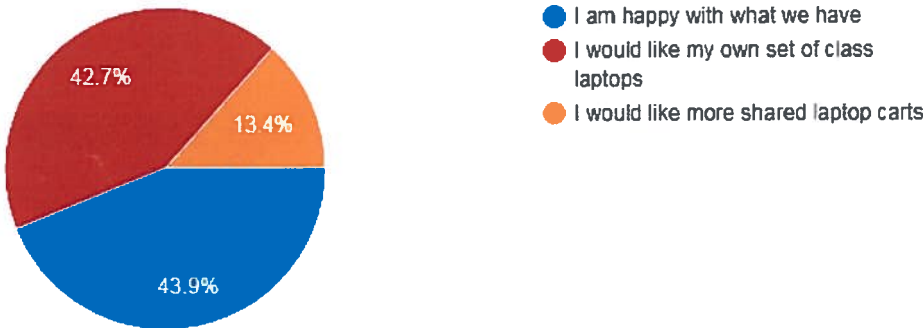
How would you describe your classroom Ed-tech Skills? (educational Programs. Google apps, Schoology, Brain-pop esc)

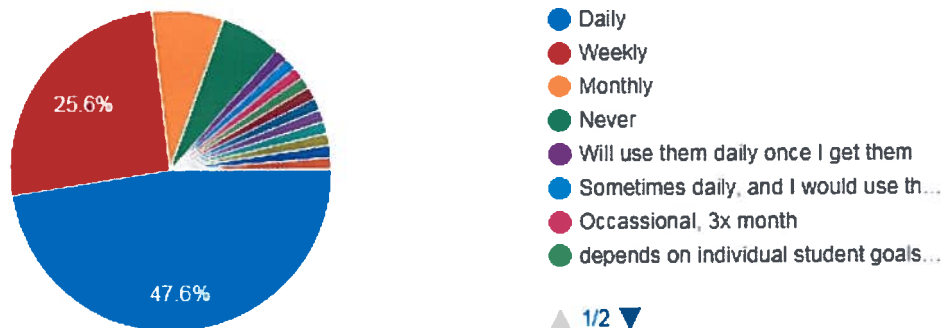

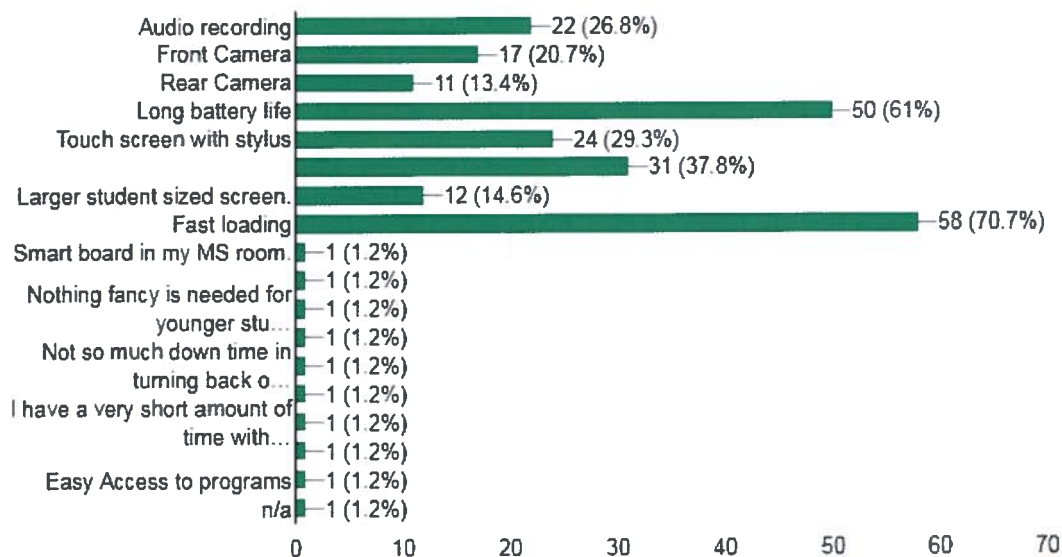
- We don't have a major need for them and sometimes other classes take priority

- When I've tried to use computers in the middle school in the past, either all the computers don't work or the students don't have a computer. I've tried to use different apps, they did not work. At the elementary, the computers are not always available, especially Manchester and Capron. If I go to a training, usually there are other teachers in there that know more than I do, so they are either talking and I can't hear the presenter or the presenter says "Now, play with the computer". I don't know what to play with, so I just sit there. When I did come in to get started the week before school started (so I could get organized) the

computer was off line. (PGE) When I put in a ticket, I am asked to do stuff that I don't know how to do, so my question is not answered sometimes. The new Powerschool.

- I would use them more if I had them in my HS room. Problem is that the COWs are unreliable- kids fault or teacher- with a variety of issues mainly because they are not shut down correctly and not plugged in to charge (individual laptops nor the cart itself). Today, online assessment, cow one, slow startup/ dead for six of them and ended up grabbing Chromebooks from another teacher.

- It is rare that I may find computers that are not in use.

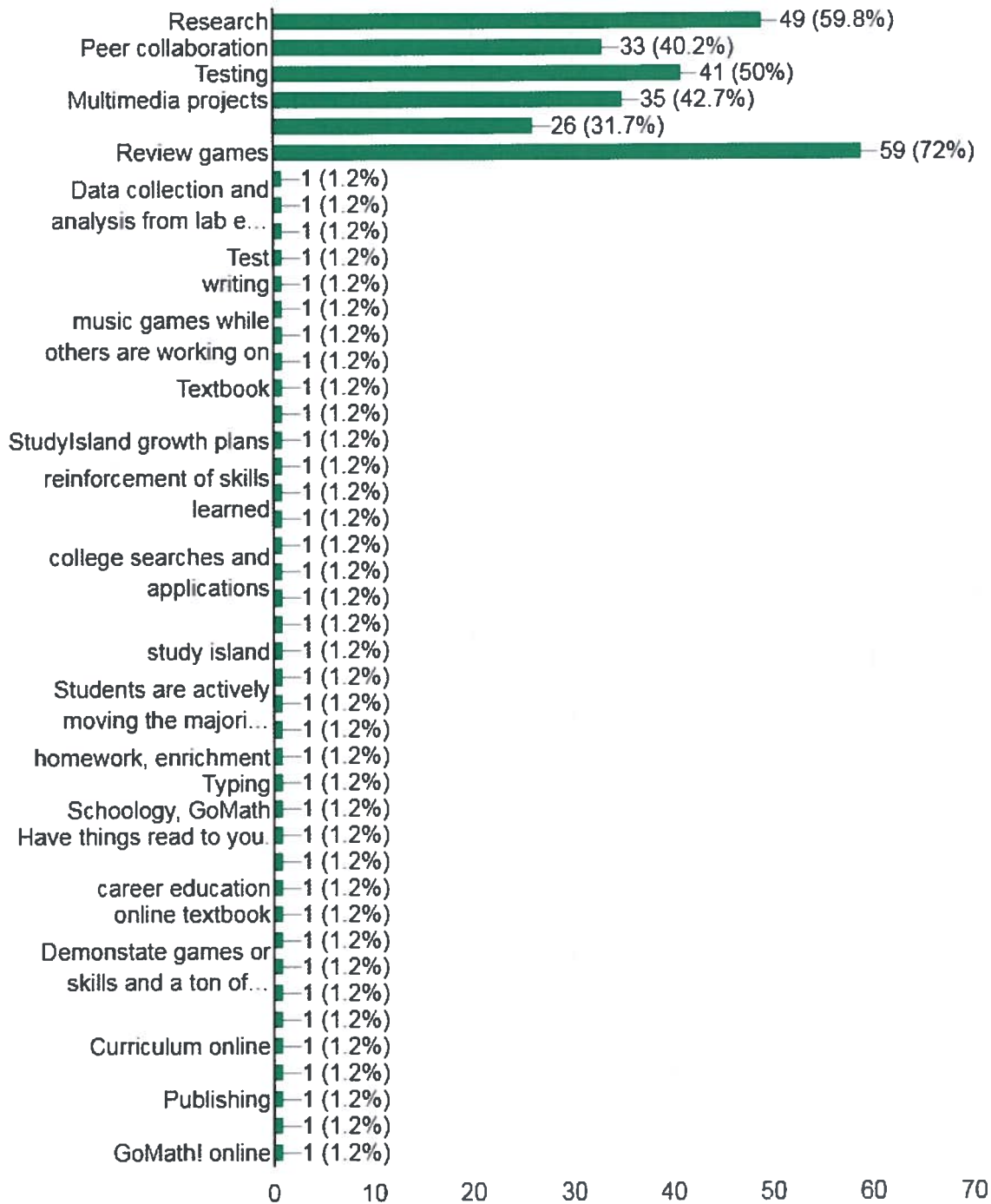
What features are you looking for in technology devices? Check all that apply

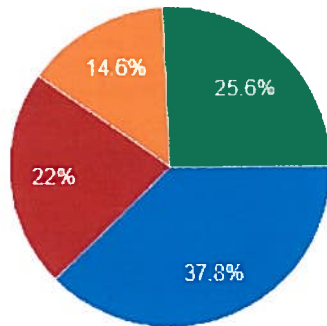
For what purposes do students use computers in the classroom? Check all that apply

Additional thoughts.

- **Wi-fi dropage is an issue in my classroom. Some kids can disconnect and reconnect and others cannot - a message pops up that says admin required. Students who can reconnect on their own can easily get back to what we are doing while the others have to go to the library and then sometimes it reconnects just being in the hall. All COWs should hold 30 laptops. It takes up too much space to have two carts in the classroom. There is not enough room. The only spot for the carts in my room is in front of the heater and in the winter the laptops get super hot.**
- **I believe that we should reconsider the filtering policy. I taught in Stoughton, Wisconsin and their District Policy was to have NO filter. If students went to inappropriate sites, we used it as an opportunity to learn. I feel that the filter is discouraging teachers and students from taking full advantage of the opportunities that are provided by the Internet.**
- **It would be nice for the high school PE teachers to have the option to have a tablet of some sort to take attendance with, have access to email throughout the day, and use as an instructional tool.**
- **Yes for 1:1 learning - I have small groups at a time, and if I had say 5 computers I could have one for all students during my group times every day. I would be interested in learning more about exit tickets and 1:1 polling and apps if that were the case. I don't get the computers now unless I'm doing a specific project that requires it because of the time lost getting, logging in and out, and returning them to shared carts.**

I'm not too picky about screen size and could do without cameras, but any fast computer that kids can audio record on and use microsoft office (or something like it, google products can be fine) would be a game changer for me.

- **More laptops at Manchester and Capron. At the Middle School - I would like to use an app where the student can go into a room and record themselves for a singing test. I realize that technology improves faster and faster. However, I would like to have a program that everyone uses, is trained on and doesn't go away the next year.
Training is key.**
- **With the direction education is heading and the technological advancements, it would be short-sighted to continue with paper copies, and paper textbooks, and limited technology devices. Students and teachers alike can benefit from the plethora of applications, uses, and programs laptops can provide. This would decrease, if not eliminate the need for the large amount of copy paper and paper materials in general. I feel we should move education in the direction of technology before our current approach becomes even more antiquated.**

- **HS- every student gets a chromebook to use at school. Assigned on book for the year(s). Picks up from their last hour teacher in the morning, and then turns them in at the end of the day. Last hour teacher checks to make sure everything is OK and plugged in.**
 - **I don't think 1:1 is appropriate for 6 year olds, maybe older grades.**
- **I would love to have enough devices for my students to have their own device to use during the day. Currently my class rotates through using the devices I have available. My students use a device for several different things throughout the course of our day.**
 - **I would love the opportunity to pilot or start a one to one classroom.**
- **I am a little hesitant with they younger ones because of all of the assistance they would need using them. I am all for technology but would sure appreciate help if we are to use them 1:1. It would take some patience!**
- **Most students use technology for entertainment. My aim is to teach students that technology can be a productivity tool too. If they can master some basic productivity techniques now, it will help them in higher education and the work world.**
- **I currently have 2 laptops in the classroom, but would prefer 3. I had 3 and one quit working and there was no replacement. We use these daily for centers. I have a small class this year so I am making it work, but 3 definitely works better. We visit the lab once a week also.**
 - **I don't have an opinion on the above question but it was mandatory. :)**
 - **I want my students to do a lot with their SeeSaw account.**
 - **The Tech team here is amazing and is very on top of things.**
- **I would use more educational programs like Schoology and Mastery Manager if I had a classroom set of laptops or we implemented a 1:1 program**
- **Please make 1:1 district-wide 5th grade and up. Then transition to the lower grades. Also, the librarian should not be in charge of fixing the tech problems.**
- **Please continue to allow students to take their devices with them to the high school. We are giving them this tool in middle school, and then we rip it away when they are going into their pivotal point in their education. Students are used to their organizational scheme they establish with their computers, taking notes on them, typing their work, etc. I feel like this is a huge**

diservice to take them away from them, and many of the students feel the same way. We live in a digital age, and to prepare them for their future, they need devices.

Also, I feel that adding another technology position to the district would benefit teachers and students. It's not fair to our librarian to be in charge of any tablet issues, and it would be nice to have a teacher as a tech person to go into their classrooms and help them develop their lessons more effectively.

- The children are expected to type responses and essays on the computer for standardized testing so it makes sense to do daily work that way, too. However, we have to be able to write with pencil and paper, too.
- It is imperative that we bring our students up to date so they can compete in today's market
- I use computers very frequently. My classroom is very collaborative and I use google classroom every day for agendas, assignments, peer collab, etc.
- 1:1 could be interesting, but is probably not necessary in lower elementary
- Laptop carts should fit 30 laptops. I have no room in my classroom for two carts and that is what I have. I am VERY UNHAPPY and FRUSTRATED that I have two carts that I have to unplug and plug in every day so I can use the outlet for other things. I cannot block my back whiteboard because students are at the board daily. Class sizes are huge and students have their stuff on the floor (laptops, math book, agenda, trapper keepers or other organizational tools, agenda, etc) and students and I trip over these items. When we are up doing math libs or scavenger hunts in the room, maneuvering around these carts is a pain. Having two carts is ridiculous!
