NBHS and NBMS both held their commencement programs since the last Board meeting. It is always nice to see so many families and staff present to support the students.

Madison Grimm was the Valedictorian of the 2015 graduating class of North Boone High School. She began her school journey at North Boone Middle School in the 7th grade. During high school Madison has participated in Student Council-4 years, yearbook staff, 2013 HOBY Ambassador, best buddies, PIT Crew, Science Olympiad, volleyball, softball, St. Joseph's Youth Group, 2015-2016 Illinois State Scholar, and is a member of the National Honor Society. Madison will attend UW LaCrosse in the fall and plans to major in Business Management. Madison has earned \$6,243.75 in local scholarship monies, and \$16,000 as recipient of Midwest Student Exchange Program for a total of \$22,243.75 in scholarships.

Kaitlyn Rapp was the Salutatorian of the 2015 graduating class of North Boone High School. She began her school journey at Capron Elementary. PARCC Testing

There will be only one 30-day testing window next year. The testing window will extend from roughly the 75 percent mark of the school year to the 90 percent mark. The exam will now consist of six or seven test units, depending on grade level, compared to the eight or nine sessions that students took this year. We are also reducing the math testing time by 60 minutes and removing a half hour from the English language arts portion for most students. Each year a limited number of students will participate in an additional embedded ELA field-test unit.

New State Superintendent

The ROE set up a meeting with Tony Smith, the new state superintendent on Friday, June 12. Melissa Geyman and I will be attending that meeting.

Special Education Audit

Mr. Ferguson's report will not be complete as he needs to wait for data from ISBE. We did receive our report card from the state where we scored a 4.0.

In his out briefing, Mr. Ferguson included the following: commented:

- Parent interviews proved positive insights. Majority of parents interviewed felt that there was either no change from last year or services have gotten better since the withdraw.
- One parent commented in regards to the positive direction special education in North Boone has taken since Dr. Baule has been in his position.
- The IEP paperwork was in compliance with the exception of a few minor areas in need of improvement which will be worked on during institute day next school year.

Overall a very positive visit from ISBE. Please find the attached *At a Glance* Melissa Geyman did for the ISBE comprehensive review.

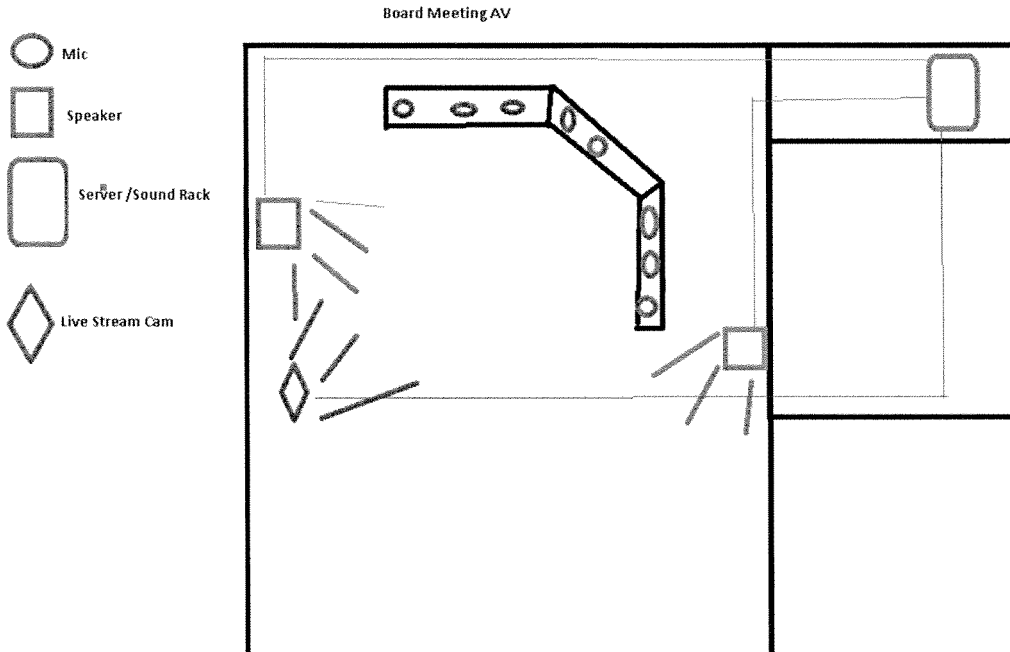

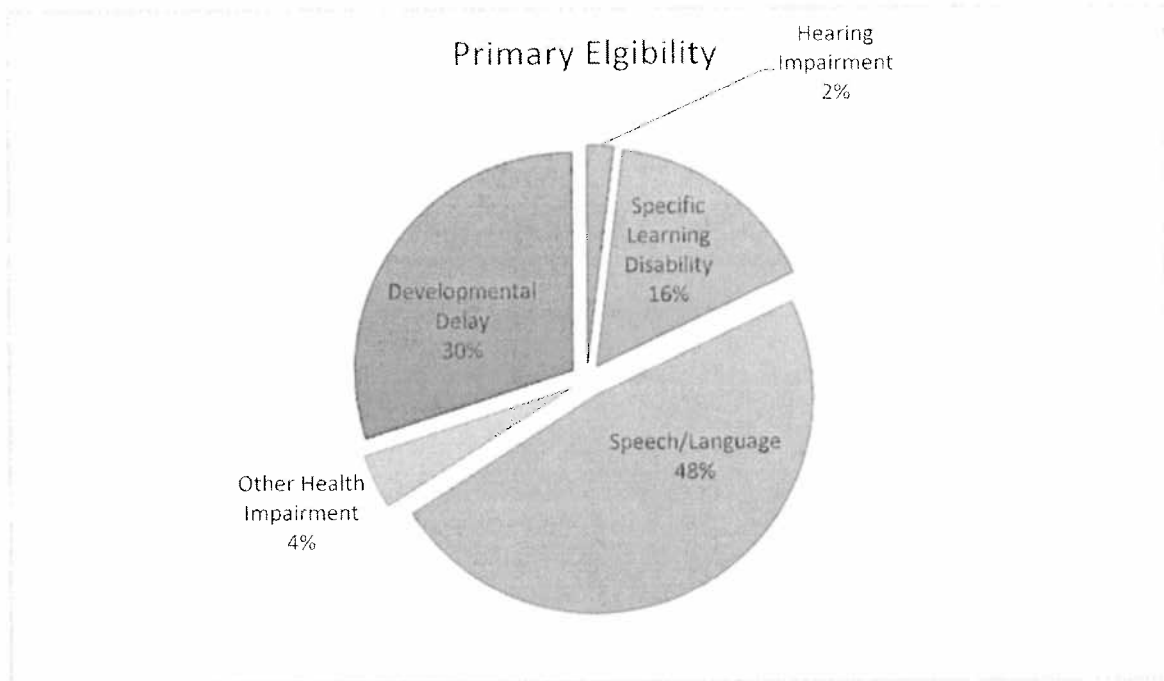
Highlights

 - Ignite (new for 2015-2016) T'NT prepares middle school students who have IEP's to be active participants in their transition plan.

Total of number of student receiving special education services: 47 out of 285



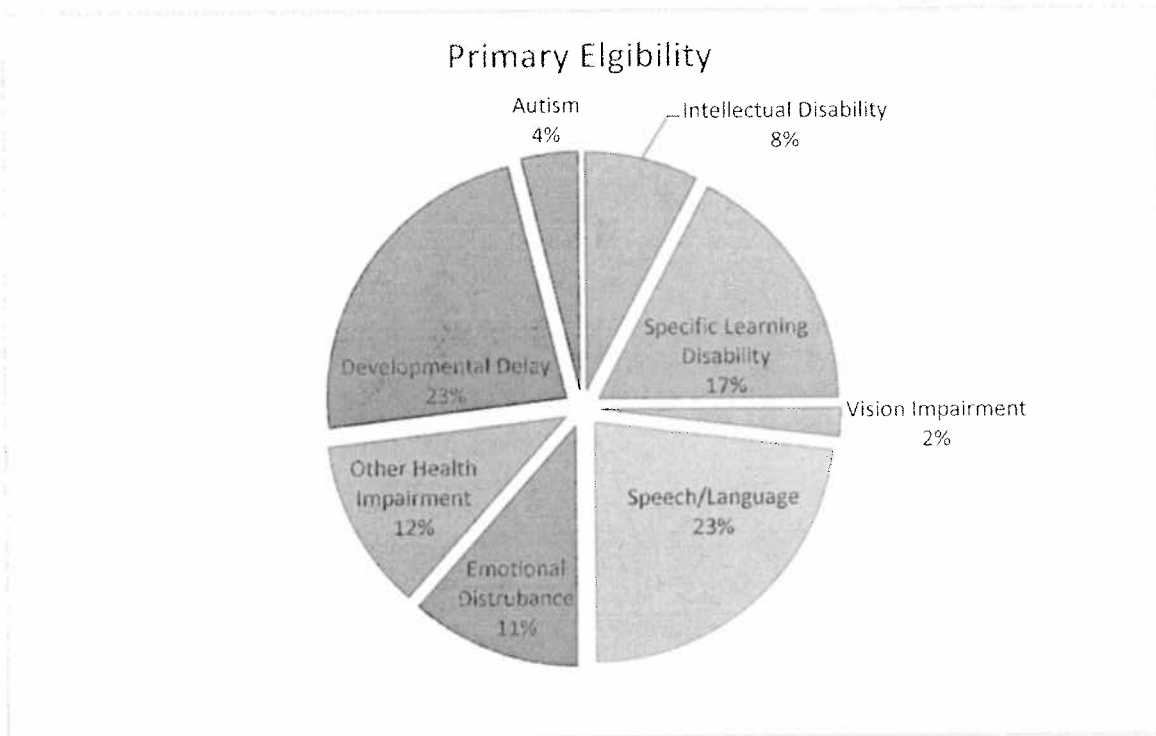

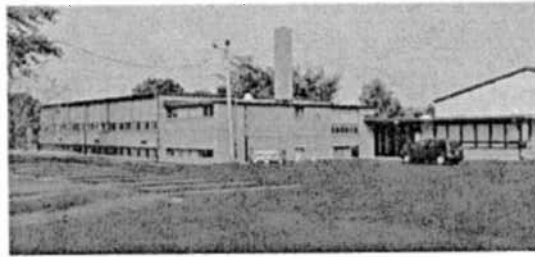

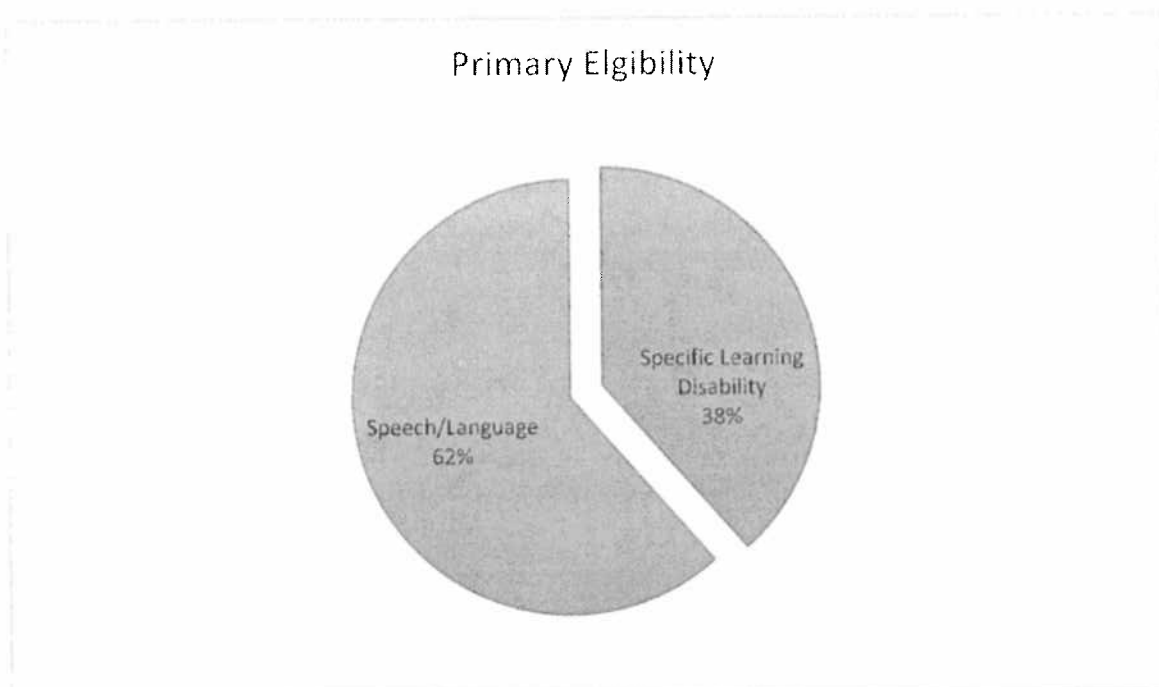

Total number of students receiving special education services: 13 out of 130



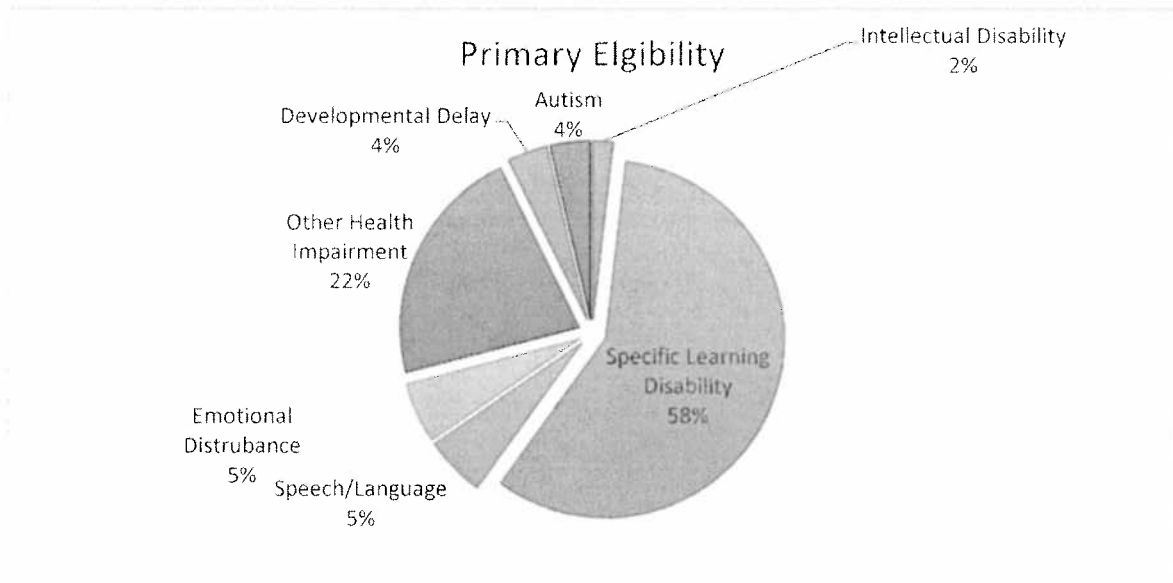

Total number of students receiving special education services: 54 out of 450



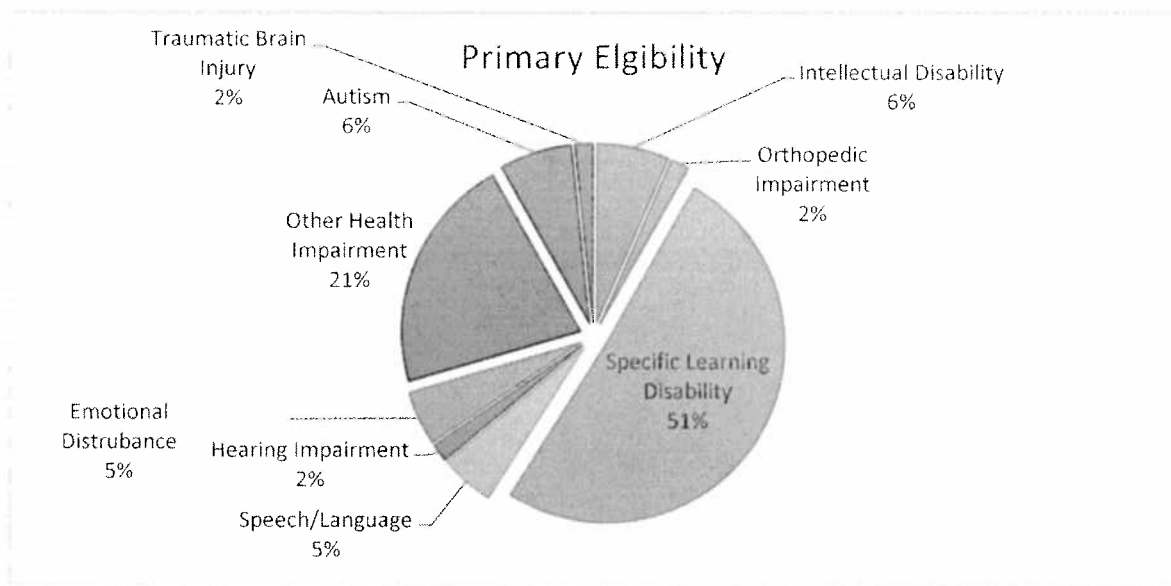

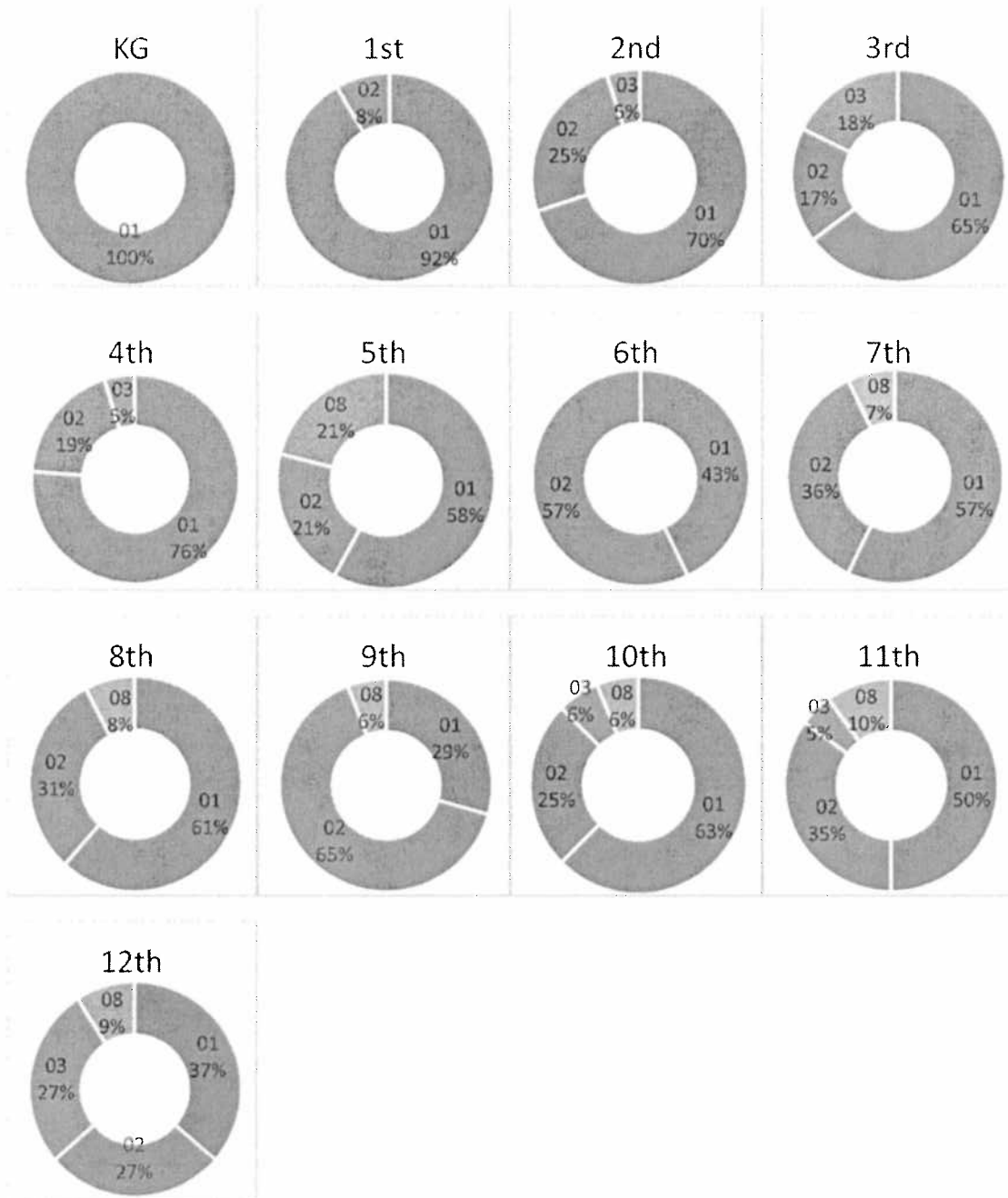

Summary of Field Trips

For two years we have been requiring our students to pay for field trips. Admittedly, as the high school principal, I have not done the best job of enforcing the practice evenly across the board. We've collected money for the field trips students have taken to Six Flags over the past two years, but I did not do a good job of enforcing it the first year in practice. This year, there were two field trips we paid out of educational supplies due to my failure to enforce it at the beginning of the year. I made a decision to not make students pay for it after the fact, but we have since been enforcing the practice evenly across the board. We do not make extracurricular activities pay for field trips as there is already a fee associated with participation in extracurricular activities.

To the best of my knowledge, we have not had students not attending field trips due to the cost of transportation. Not that it matters, but I know other districts have their students pay for transportation costs as I have had to pay for transportation for my daughters who attend the Kinnickinick School District. The fee is put into the cost of the field trip.

If anyone has any further questions on the matter, I'd be more than happy to speak about it.
