

## REGIONAL OFFICE OF EDUCATION BOONE-WINNEBAGO COUNTIES

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## Dear Representative

We are writing to express our significant concerns over the continued decrease in education funding from the State of Illinois. Attached are several documents which illustrate the diminished financial support facing local school districts. These documents show the actual decline of General State Aid revenues and the minimal support for the increasingly expanding special education requirements. The third sheet highlights the impact of the upcoming fees associated with the Affordable Care Act school districts will have to pay beginning in July 2014. The Affordable Care Act will impact school districts even more significantly when it comes to the thirty hour work week and health insurance eligibility.

As the State has decreased its financial support for school districts, the emphasis on local property taxes to fund education increases. This is especially true when it comes to financially supporting our statutory obligations for special education. Unfortunately, most school districts are also facing declining property values. As you know decreasing taxable property values increase the actual tax rates and many districts are at or approaching their maximum tax rates allowed under the law. This will continue to require districts to reduce opportunities for children, and put off safety improvements and other critical facilities work until Illinois's school facilities are crumbling.

In addition, over the past several years the State of Illinois's reimbursements for mandated categoricals including, special education and transportation have not been paid in a timely fashion. Often we receive only half of the reimbursement payments in the proper fiscal year. We are required to provide transportation services for children, which is another area where the State of Illinois has decreased its financial support by proration. These prorations are often for expenses previously incurred by the districts so they are not able to adjust programming and have to use fund balances or borrow to cover these costs.

As our representatives, we encourage you to fully fund General State Aid and the mandated categoricals especially special education and transportation. Please consider the financial impact of adding additional requirements on schools when you vote. The passage of laws without providing full financial support adds to the burden of the local property tax payer. The ability to provide sound educational programming is significantly reduced as school districts attempt to balance budgets and in many cases run deficits.

We would ask that the legislature develop a plan to provide school districts with adequate and stable funding. Also, where the district is required to meet state mandates those be fully funded without exception.

We welcome your questions and the opportunity to discuss these critical issues with you.
