Complaints About Curriculum, Instructional Materials, and Programs

Parents/guardians have the right to inspect any instructional material used as part of their child's educational curriculum pursuant to School Board policy 7:15, *Student and Family Privacy Rights*.

Persons who believe that curriculum, instructional materials, or programs violate rights guaranteed by any law or Board policy should file a complaint using Board policy 2:260, *Uniform Grievance Procedure*.

Persons with all other suggestions or complaints about curriculum, instructional materials, and/or programs should complete a ~~curriculum objection~~Curriculum Objection form ~~and/or use the Uniform Grievance Procedure.~~ A parent/guardian may request that his/her child be exempt from using a particular instructional material or program by completing a ~~curriculum objection~~Curriculum Objection form.
