Instruction

Complaints About Curriculum, Instructional Materials, and Programs

Parents/guardians have the right to inspect any instructional material used as part of their child's educational curriculum pursuant to School Board policy 7:15, *Student and Family Privacy Rights*.

Persons who believe that curriculum, instructional materials, or programs violate rights guaranteed by any law or Board policy should file a complaint using Board policy 2:260, *Uniform Grievance Procedure*. Persons with <u>all other</u> suggestions or complaints about curriculum, instructional materials, andor programs should complete a <u>curriculum objection</u> form<u>and/or use the Uniform Grievance</u> Procedure. A parent/guardian may request that his/her child be exempt from using a particular instructional material or program by completing a <u>curriculum objection</u> form.
