Student Appearance

A student's appearance, including dress and grooming hygiene, must not disrupt the educational process, interfere with the maintenance of a positive teaching/learning climate, or compromise reasonable standards of health and safety. The District does not prohibit hairstyles historically associated with race, ethnicity, or hair texture, including, but not limited to, protective hairstyles such as braids, locks, and twists. Students who disrupt the educational process or compromise standards of health, and safety, and decency. must modify their appearance. Procedures for handling students who dress or groom inappropriately guiding student appearance will be developed by the Superintendent or designee and included in the Student Handbook. (s).
