- 4. Utilize Study Island and other enrichment content leveled tasks and assignments that will drive instruction.

 - ** 4 failing quarters will mean student will need to do 4 weeks of Summer School

POWER SCHOLARS 2018

Power Scholars Camp is designed to be the support program for youth after they finish their day in extended school year. The pilot program will take place on site at Capron Elementary School. The program will be held for the duration of extended school year. Students will attend extended school year from the morning until 11:30am. At 11:30am, students will transfer over to Power Scholars and begin a structured schedule that will go until 3:30pm. From 3:30pm to 5:30pm, campers will have supervised free time.

The following key program elements make up the experience:

Daily Activities

Community Time, Lunch & Recreation: Students, called "scholars," start the day with lunch and community time activity to develop leadership skills and strong friendships with fellow scholars and staff. Scholars spend approximately 10 minutes engaging in physical activity during recess at the end of this time.

Enrichment: Scholars rotate through enrichment opportunities during the afternoon. Themes typically include:

☑ Life and leadership development, such as character development, social and emotional learning, civic values, substance and violence prevention, and service-learning.

② Science, technology, engineering, and math enrichment courses that enable scholars to engage in these fields in fun, non-traditional ways.

Health and fitness activities including a wide array of traditional and non-traditional subjects.

☑ Creative arts providing scholars opportunities to explore art, writing, music, drama, and other artistic expression.

Additional activities are considered and included as determined through community interest.

In addition to the daily schedule described above, other Power Scholars Academy program elements include:

Mentor Days: Scholars participate weekly in community-service projects and interaction with community leaders who visit the program as guest speakers to showcase their professions and inspire scholars to pursue excellence.

Family Engagement: Each program has at least two family events, usually an open house prior to the program start and a family event to close out the program and celebrate the scholars' success.

Academic Curriculum

The Power Scholars Academy program will support the curriculum offered through the teachers in the extended school program.

The program will be free of charge to participants. The majority of the youth in this program will fall below the poverty line and would make it nearly impossible for families to pay for the services during the program. Funding for this program comes from the gracious and generous support from Community Foundation of Northern Illinois.
