Bus Repair or Purchase

Current Reality: We have a bus that is currently sitting in the shop waiting to have a transmission fixed. We inquired about trade-in value, as is, and they indicated that they would give salvage value. An important point is that the state is currently reimbursing this categorical at around 80% max. Full Transportation Fleet Data

Caveat: The turbo that went out in bus 84 cost \$8,315.46. We can depreciate this repair cost for 3 years, if we choose to do so. Invoice

Option 1: Do not repair the bus and purchase a new bus. Options are presented below.
