Students will be expected to demonstrate understanding through writing, projects, and discussions. Writing will include informative and argumentative essays using MLA guidelines with an emphasis on textual evidence and supporting a claim. Students will also focus on preparing for the SAT by learning preparation strategies and completing practice.
